
In recent years, the CSCD is increasingly turning to international cooperation and participation in international projects.

This database includes information on more than 2,000 cultural organizations in Serbia (museums, archives, institutes for the protection of cultural monuments, theatres, galleries, cinemas, citizen associations, etc.). In addition, experts at CSCD were engaged in creating the series of local strategy plans. Since 1968 CSCD has published Kultura – Review for the theory and sociology of culture and for the cultural policy, which is a highly-ranked academic journal on a national level.

Inputs by lectures give the possibility to discuss themes of interest. Bridge language is English, consecutive translation by volunteers via Zoom's translator channels allows those who don't know English to understand it as well. In language circles (EN, F, IT) international exchange takes place. DANECT fosters encounters and exchange of ideas which can be deepened by using the online platform ViMA danube. An excellent method when there is no opportunity to meet in person.




The preventive program "Lighthouse of Freedom" helps socially marginalized groups in Bosnia-Herzegovina to obtain legal status such as birth registration, identity documents and residence permits, to ensure that they do not become victims of human trafficking (human trafficking is defined as any act whereby a person forces another person to do something and benefits from it).

Important findings/results/experiences

Socially disadvantaged members of the Roma minority, who are legally invisible, without citizenship or residence permits, are supported through social work and the assumption of expenses. Faros also initiates the adaptation of laws to international human rights standards to ensure legal status for all people.

Important findings/results/experiences

Shared activities together with an attractive, positive group experience create a competing counterbalance to the uniqueness of the lifestyle, provide new starting points for changing actions and strategies in the immediate social environment, for example, attend school regularly instead of marrying early (improving the ability to act socially (ego stabilisation)). By creating altered experiences, an altered consciousness is generated, often leading to involvement in terms of changing living conditions at the level of the neighbourhood, community or society, for example organising a district festival or a round table on the subject of discrimination (changed awareness through changed experiences)



Important findings/results/experiences


Having less possibilities to be involved in social giving and receiving processes, older people slowly become socially invisible.


