

Danube-Networkers satisfied with their contribution to the Danube Festival

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Ulm. The Danube-Networkers are very satisfied with their extensive programme at the Danube Festival and how smoothly it went. Carmen Stadelhofer, Chairwoman of ILEU, the Institute for Virtual and Face-to-Face Learning in Adult Education, reports this. ILEU coordinates the work of the Danube-Networkers.

Participants in the "Intergenerational Dialogue in the Danube Region" met in person in Ulm - people who normally speak German together online in language tandems. The youngest was a 15-year-old Ukrainian and the oldest an 85-year-old German woman. It was the tenth meeting of the Danube-Networkers. The conference "Democracy Needs All of Us" at the Edwin Scharff House was the heart of the meeting. 150 participants attended. Two innovations were tested: AI simultaneously displayed statements on a screen in several languages of the Danube countries. In addition, public figures listened to the concerns of conference participants. Ulm's First Mayor Martin Bendel was among those who agreed to take part.
